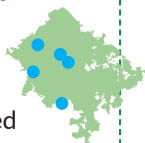
City Council Retreat

Area-Specific Work Kicks Off

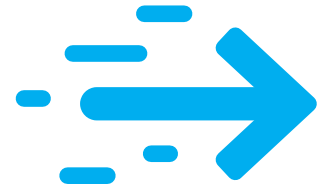
Area-specific visioning and code testing efforts kicked off in late February. Representatives from five areas of the city convened to identify opportunities and issues that the code may be able to address, both within the five areas and citywide.

- North Laurens Road



What's Next?



Draft Code Takes Shape

Foundational elements of the new development code will begin to emerge over the next few months, with several distinguishing characteristics:



- **Neighborhood character** will be safeguarded much more effectively



- Almost all new growth over the coming decades will be accommodated by increased height and density along city corridors and at key intersections (nodes)



- **Stormwater management** will be significantly improved by raising the standards for new development, including residential infill
